The purpose of the Friends of the Paul V. Corusy Library Trust is to:

Support the library with additional purchases of equipment as necessary to enhance the operations to serve the members of IAAO.

With the approval of the Trust Committee, the IAAO Executive Director or its designee has the authority to write checks on the fund. No part of the Trust shall inure to the private benefit of the administrators of the committee.

The proceeds of the Trust will be distributed to deserving research papers, educational material, reference material or equipment that are important to all IAAO members, councils or articles in IAAO publications. Applications must be submitted in writing on the prescribed form. All applicants must be a member of IAAO in good standing. The number of purchases or grants awarded each year will be subject to the availability of funds or other constraints.
